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Subject: Obligatory Regime for Vaccination

1. High vaccination ratio is fundamental to success of "Pandemic Exit Strategy" in Pakistan. An organized regime has been strategized to realize the successful exit strategy and achieve desired tangible vaccination targets. Aforementioned, an obligatory regime will be followed from dates mentioned against each. No individual will be entertained in under mentioned sectors, if vaccination criteria as described below is not met.

2. Implementation Methodology

a. Soft Launch of Obligatory Regime

- (1) Obligatory regime will be launched in phases. First phase i.e Soft Launch (1-15 Sep 2021) will be used for extensive communication and advertisement at prominent places (Bus stands, ticketing offices, toll plazas, rest areas & railways stations).
- (2) People will not be denied any facility, instead they will be asked to get vaccinated (federating units to ensure availability of mob vaccination teams at required places).

b. Monitoring Mechanism

(1) Checking Transport at Point of Origin (Bus Stands)

- (a) All types of public transport be checked for vaccination at point of origin by bus stop manager. MVTs should be placed for vaccination at bus stand, rest areas and other suitable locations.
- (b) Bus stand manager will sign a verification certificate (having date and time on a format given by federating unit).
- (c) The verification certificate will be displayed on wind screen of public transport for unhindered crossing at toll plazas.
- (d) Traffic, motorways and national highways police and district administration will be responsible for implementation.
- (e) Vaccination is mandatory for complete staff working at bus stands.

(2) Checking Mechanism for Railways

- (a) No tickets will be issued to un-vaccinated. Moreover, ticket checkers and other staff will be responsible for enroute checking.
- (b) MVTs to be made available at railway stations.

(3) Checking Mechanism at Airports. Existing mechanism of checking vaccine certificates before issuing boarding passes to be further streamlined.

(4) IT based (minimum human intervention) – Efforts being made to develop system for linking ticketing of PIA, PR, selected bus services and M tags / motorways toll plazas with NIMS.

(5) Vaccination at Public Offices and Educational Institutions. It will be prime responsibility of head of institution/ office. Moreover, district administration teams will also supervise implementation.

(6) Vaccination at Hotels, Restaurants and Shopping Malls. Owner of facility is responsible for implementation of policy. Violators will be checked by police and district administration.

(2) Three Tiered Monitoring

- (1) Tier 1 - Self Monitoring. Monitoring by owner of malls, hotels, restaurants etc and head of institutions of schools/ colleges and public offices.
- (2) Tier 2 - Monitoring by Civil Administration. Monitoring by local civil administration through random checking / verification.
- (3) Tier 3 - Monitoring by NCOC. Monitoring mechanism by NCOC and provinces through random checking and seeking regular feedback.

3. All federating units, institutions and entities are requested to implement obligatory regime in true letter and spirit.
